Girl Scouts Troops Team Up to Save the Environment One Bottle at a Time
TerraCycle Buys Bottles For Worm-Poop Plant Food

Waseca, MN (Sept, 15th): Two local Girl Scout troops have join forces in their collection of used, 20 ounce soda pop bottles. Girl Scout Troops 3803 and 3810 are collecting the bottles to raise money for a trip, possibly to California. The money is donated by TerraCycle, Inc. who donates 5 cents for each bottle collected. TerraCycle reuses the pop bottles to package their all-natural plant food made from worm poop!

So far, the girls from Troop 3803 have saved over almost 5,000 bottles from becoming trash. This impressive total makes the girls the #1 collectors of pop bottles in TerraCycle's Bottle Brigade. The girl's campaign is part of a nationwide collection being organized by TerraCycle, called the Bottle Brigade. Loree Tetzloff, who runs the campaign for the Troops, said, "It is a great opportunity for the girls to help the environment and themselves at the same time!"
